**Required Information**

- A copy of your student council constitution.
- A one-paragraph description of the student leadership structure at your school (i.e.- Student Council, Leadership Team, Leadership Class).
- Written agendas and minutes from two student council meetings.
- A letter of recommendation from your school principal or assistant principal.

**Project Information**

Attach detailed information regarding your Student Council/Leadership activities for the current school year in the following areas. To qualify for the **Outstanding Council Achievement Award**, complete all of the required information and all four of the project categories. To qualify as an **Honor Council**, complete all of the required information and any three of the four following project categories.

**1. Community Involvement and Service**

Submit a one-page description of a service project conducted by your student council that helped your community or school. Be sure to include project goals, actions taken and results in your description. Attach to the description any supporting materials such as a sample advertising flier, newspaper article, etc.

**2. School Climate**

Submit a description of the project or projects conducted by your student council that helped to improve school climate. Examples would include those projects designed to:

- promote harmony among the school populations.
- contribute to a positive learning environment.
- enhance the school facility.

**3. Citizenship/Democracy Education**

Submit a description of the strategies your student council used to promote citizenship and democracy education. Consider ways that you:

- encourage participation by faculty, staff, students and parents in school activities.
- advise community or school officials on local issues directly affecting the quality of education.
- work with community leaders to improve school-community relations.
- provide input on local community issues and programs.

**4. Other Projects and Programs**

Select a successful project or program that your council completed this year. Submit a one-page description of the project. Be sure to include project goals, actions taken and results in your description. Attach to the description any supporting materials such as a sample advertising flier, newspaper article, etc.
