



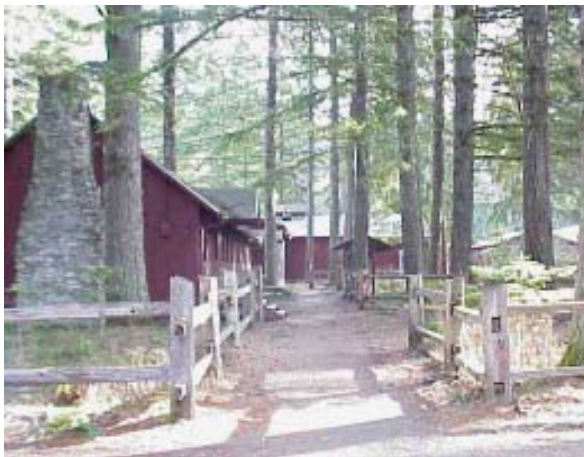
Phone Calls

There is no cell phone service coverage from the remote Cispus Center. Students can use a pay phone to call home. Camps keep to a busy schedule and there is little time to call home. The phone lines to the Cispus Center are used for business and emergencies, but not personal calls.

The mission of the Cispus Learning Center is to furnish functional, aesthetically sound facilities, and curricular resources for supporting outdoor education and leadership training to young people. The beautiful 70-acre campus is located in the Gifford-Pinchot national forest 11 miles from Highway 12 (White Pass) and the town of Randle.



Students are housed in separate male and female dorms that hold 24 students and two junior counselors. Each dorm is equipped with six private shower stalls.



Cispus is a "school" in the woods. The 18 classrooms, two auditoriums, gym, library, campfire areas, nature trails and dining hall provide the space for outstanding educational programs.
