PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Program Overview has valuable information. Please read it carefully and distribute copies to your student delegates.

RESERVE YOUR SPACE

Schools may reserve delegate spaces up to May 31 with a School Registration Form and a purchase order. If Delegate Registration/Medical Forms are not postmarked by May 31, reserved spaces will be relinquished. After May 31 only packets including delegate forms will be accepted.

REGISTRATION FEES (Delegation Size and Fees)

Cispus - maximum 16 delegates per school, per session / 6 days - 5 nights - \$290/\$300 (WASC Member/Non-WASC Member)

Chewelah - maximum 12 delegates per school, per session / 5 days - 4 nights - \$280/\$290 (WASC Member/Non-WASC Member)

DELEGATE FORMS

Collect, sign and mail Delegate Registration/Medical Forms as a packet **BY MAY 31**. (The form may be completed electronically, printed and appropriate signatures obtained.) Register only students who can commit to their camp session from start to finish. Mail your delegate forms as a packet; DO NOT FAX.

TRANSPORTATION

1. Students may use the charter bus service arranged by the Association of Washington School Principals. Buses are scheduled based on the registration requests. Delegates riding the bus should plan to ride round trip. Students using our bus service will be mailed a copy of their pickup location and departure time approximately one week prior to their camp session.
2. Delegates may be transported to Leadership Camp by a school official, a parent or an adult authorized by the school.
STUDENT DRIVERS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

Who should attend Leadership Camp?

Camp is designed for high school students entering grades 9-12 who want to make a positive difference at their school. Students may or may not hold an elected office. We require that they are recommended and registered as part of an official school delegation. Washington State Leadership Camps provide outstanding opportunities for all students. Consider sending officers from ASB, Class, NHS, Career & Technical Clubs, Cheerleaders, Student Council Reps, Team Captains and other emerging leaders.

Why should I attend?

Positive, trained student leaders make a difference. School principals believe this...that is why they sponsor Washington Student Leadership. Since 1956, Washington's student leaders have been attending "Leadership Camp." You'll find past delegates still leading in business, education, government and communities. Make a difference for yourself and others...register for Leadership Camp now!

Where is Leadership Camp?

Five sessions are held at the Cispus Learning Center, 12 miles southeast of Randle, Washington in the Gifford Pinchot National Forest. One of the sessions is held at the Chewelah Peak Learning Center, approximately one hour north of Spokane near the 49 Degrees North ski resort. The Association of Washington School Principals operates both facilities. Family-style meals are served in a dining hall, and delegates are housed in dorms.

How do I get there?

Charter bus service to and from camp is available for an additional fee. Students can also be transported to camp by their school, sponsor or parent. **Student drivers are NOT allowed.**

What curriculum is covered?

Leadership camp is an intensive week of leadership training with delegates from all areas of Washington State.

Registration Reminders

- Please register students who can commit to their camp session from start to finish! All camps start at noon on day one and conclude in the early afternoon on the final day.
- Delegates must be entering grades 9-12, be enrolled in high school, and be registered as a part of a school delegation.

United States Senate Youth Program Scholarships

Annually, each state selects two student leaders to participate in the United States Youth Senate program sponsored by the William Randolph Hearst Foundation. State winners participate in a week-long program in Washington, DC and receive a \$5,000 scholarship. In Washington State, taking part in an AWSP sponsored Summer Leadership Camp is the only way to become eligible for the scholarship. A selection process is held during each session of camp, with finalists competing at the state level for the honor of representing Washington in this prestigious program.
