PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Program Overview provides valuable information. Please read it carefully and distribute copies to your student delegates.

RESERVE YOUR SPACE

Complete and return the School Registration Form with a purchase order to reserve your space. Process your school registration early; there is no need to wait until elections are over to reserve your space. To finalize your registration and avoid cancellation fees, collect, sign and mail Delegate Registration/Medical Forms as a packet by June 15.

REGISTRATION FEES (Delegation Size and Fees)

Cispus- maximum 14 delegates per school, per session / 4 days-3 nights - \$200/\$210 (WASC Member/Non-Member)

Chewelah- maximum 12 per school, per session / 4 days-3 nights - \$200/\$210 (WASC Member/Non-Member)

DELEGATE FORMS

Collect, sign and mail Delegate Registration/Medical Forms as a packet **BY JUNE 15**. (The form may be completed electronically, printed and appropriate signatures obtained.) Delegates must be entering grades 7, 8 or 9 and be registered as a part of the school delegation. Register only students who can commit to their camp session from start to finish.

CAMP SELECTION

The most important consideration when selecting a session of camp is date. Find a session that all delegates can commit to from start to finish. All sessions teach to the same goals and objectives and all are structured to meet the needs of middle school and junior high leaders.

ADVISER WORKSHOP

An optional adviser workshop runs concurrently with each session of camp. Participants attend their own seminar, designed specifically for middle level advisers. Mail a complete, legible and signed Delegate Registration/Medical Form for each adviser attending. Twenty clock hours are available for \$40. Fees, registration and cancellation policy are the same as for student delegates.

CANCELLATION POLICY

All cancellations received after June 15 will result in a non-refundable processing fee of \$50. If a cancellation is made less than five working days prior to camp, the full charge of camp will apply. Full charges apply for delegates who leave early or do not show up for camp. All cancellations must be received in writing from a school official by the specified date.

- students holding elected offices or students with an interest in developing leadership skills; *and...*
- students who are part of the official school delegation.

What curriculum is covered?

Middle Level Camp is a unique leadership experience designed specifically for middle level students. The staff is composed of enthusiastic, highly trained and dedicated teachers, counselors, administrators and college students. The curriculum is based on the goals and objectives of **Washington Student Leadership**. Both facilities are operated by the Association of Washington School Principals. Family-style meals are served in the dining hall, and delegates are housed in dorms.
