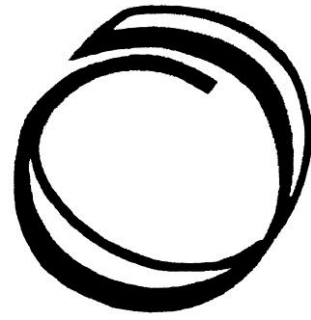


Mount Olympus Leadership Camp

July 12 – 17, 2009



We are looking forward to your participation at Mt. Olympus 2009, “Leadership: Get in the Game!” You will spend the week with over 250 amazing delegates representing more than 45 high schools in the state of Washington.

What to expect: Our leadership staff consists of teachers, counselors, business professionals, and college students from around the state. We also have a full-time nurse on staff. You will be housed in dorms with bunks for 24 delegates (please do not bring large sums of money or valuables to camp). The bathrooms have 5 showers each, and electrical outlets are at a minimum.

When to arrive: Camp begins on July 12th. Registration and lunch run from 11:30 to 1:00. PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE EARLY—we won’t be ready for your arrival until 11:30. You must ride the arranged charter bus or have a ride to/from camp with your parent; **student drivers are not allowed**. Camp ends at noon on July 17th. You must stay for the entire session; if you cannot attend the whole week, contact your adviser about finding a substitute.

What to bring:

Prepare for six days of sun, rain, or both—after all, this is Washington! There are no washers or dryers.

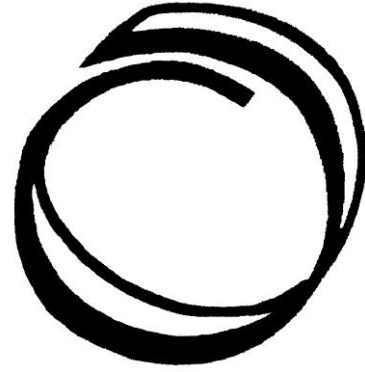

Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Mt. Olympus Leadership Camp that your son or daughter will be attending is sponsored by the Association of Washington School Principals and is one of eight high school camps in the state. Our goal is to develop the leadership potential of outstanding high school students from all areas of Washington.

Our trained staff consists of teachers, counselors, and professionals from around the state. In addition, a nurse is on staff and available 24 hours a day. Please make sure we are aware of all allergies and health conditions and concerns. If it becomes necessary for a delegate to return home because of an illness, parents are responsible for picking up their student at camp.

Please help us by clearing your student's calendar for the entire session. It is extremely disruptive to all when we lose individuals in the middle of camp to other commitments. It significantly reduces the total educational experience of the conference. The culminating activities of the last full day and final morning at camp are the most important and meaningful to delegates. It is crucial that they remain the ENTIRE week. If your student cannot attend the whole week, please talk to their adviser and consider sending another student who will be available for the entire program.

Discipline is rarely a problem. It should be noted that usual school rules apply. Drinking, illegal substances, smoking, weapons, and fighting will not be tolerated. Any explicit dancing of a sexual nature or unwanted physical contact is prohibited at camp because it creates a hostile environment and is sexual harassment. Even though it is summer, please also remind your son or daughter that clothing packed for camp should also be clothing that would be appropriate to wear to school.

We are looking forward to the arrival of the delegates and the opportunity to watch their leadership skills grow in just six short days. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact us.
