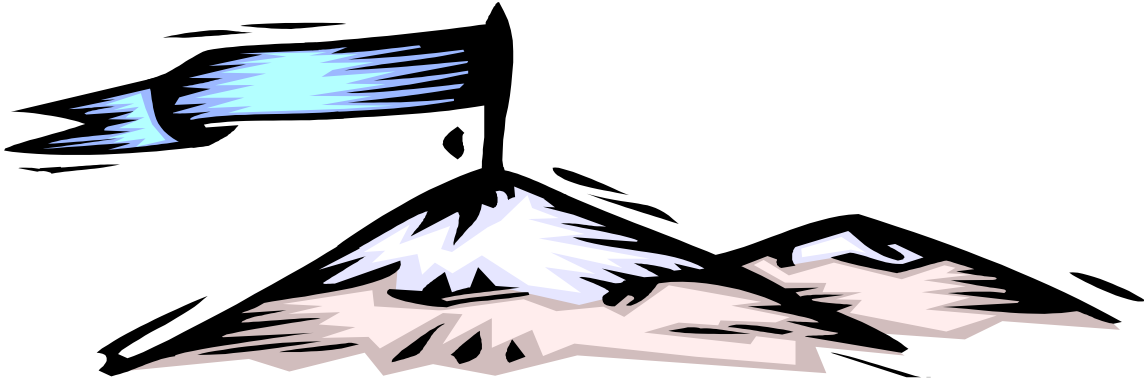


Chewelah Peak

WELCOME to Middle Level Leadership Camp at Chewelah Peak Learning Center! You can expect a week filled with activity, learning and fun! As a representative of your school, you will be expected to be a positive participant in all activities. Camp rules, in general, shadow basic school rules; wear appropriate clothing, respect yourself and others, be on time, etc. Those students who do not follow the camp behavior expectations will be sent home *at parent's expense*.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE TIMES

Camp begins at 1:30 p.m. on Monday Aug 10th. Please work to arrive no earlier than 11:30 a.m. Camp ends at 12:30 p.m. on Thursday Aug 13th. Early departures are *strongly discouraged*.

A sack lunch will be provided when you arrive at Chewelah Peak and another one the day you depart.

EMERGENCY PHONE/MAIL

There is a phone available for emergencies only. Delegates to camp will need to have a calling card to call home. There is very limited cell service at Chewelah Peak. The camp office # is 509-935-7400 (answered during the day). Mailing address is 3215 Flowery Trail Road, Chewelah, WA 99109.

MEDICAL CARE

Our staff is available to handle routine and emergency medical situations. If your son or daughter becomes so ill that he/she needs a doctor's attention, you will be contacted. All medications **MUST** be turned in at the registration table during the registration process at camp. Every camper must have a completed medical form on file.

The Accident Insurance of Association of Washington School Principal's Student Leadership Program is secondary to your coverage.

CANCELLATIONS

If something happens and you will not be able to attend camp, it is important that you do the following:

1. Contact your adviser or principal immediately! Your school is counting on you. With advance notice, your adviser/principal will probably be able to find a student to attend in your place. Otherwise, your ASB will forfeit your space and the money they paid so you could attend.

Refund policy: Delegates may cancel up to June 15, 2009 with a full refund. All cancellations received after June 15, 2009, will result in a non-refundable processing fee of \$50.00. If cancellation is made less than five working days prior to your camp, the full charge of \$200 (\$210 non-member) will result.
